Key Points 1

MATCH Home Care Technologies

- generations of telecare technology:
 - 1st generation (simple, active, 1.5M alarms in UK)
 - 2nd generation (passive, non-invasive monitoring)
 - 3rd generation (proactive, preventative)
 - 4th generation (smart, intelligent)??
- technology design:
 - informed consent becomes more difficult as technology advances
 - poor design should not stigmatise the user
 - assistive technology should 'make the grandchildren jealous'

Key Points 2



- issues:
 - technology adoption is moving very slowly (since 1992)
 - the user should control the technology, not vice versa
 - managing reactive care services is already challenging, proactive services will be more so
- training and education:
 - should be in University/College courses
 - vital for professional carers and support staff
 - end users and informal carers also need awareness of technology benefits and limitations





- future events:
