

## **LASC Club Rules.**

1. Members are bound to comply with the rules of the Loch Lomond and Trossachs National Park and Queen Elizabeth Forest Park of which the club site is a part.
2. Members must comply with and adhere to the club constitution and with the Sailing Instructions at all times whether racing or not.
3. Adequate personal buoyancy must be worn at all times when on the water.
4. Boats parked ashore or moored must be properly secured to prevent damage to adjacent craft or property.
5. All owners of craft must have a valid insurance cover that gives a protection against third party liability of not less than £1,000,000, throughout the year.
6. No open fires may be lit on the club ground.
7. Members may camp on the club grounds with the prior approval of the committee. Contact Email [comm@lochardsc.org.uk](mailto:comm@lochardsc.org.uk).
8. Overnight use of camper and caravans is not permitted.
9. The Club can take no responsibility for the loss of, or damage to, personal property left on the club site.
10. No parking is permitted on the access road, forestry road or causeway.
11. Breakages of or faults in club equipment must be promptly reported to the DCM or other committee member who will raise the problem/fault with the appropriate club officer.
12. Dogs must be kept under control at all times and are *NOT* allowed in the club house. (disabled persons guide dogs exempt)
13. Sailing visitors may be introduced by any individual member of the club upon payment of a visitor fee.
14. Members introducing visitors will be responsible for the visitors and for ensuring that visitors' fees are placed in the box provided and that the visitors' book is signed.
15. Members must notify the Membership Secretary of any change of address, phone number, boat or other relevant particulars occurring during the year or upon resigning from the club.
16. Cadet members must be supervised by their parent or guardian (or a designated adult) at all times, and are not the responsibility of the club.
17. Club dinghies must be signed out/in by a full member who will be responsible for the dinghies, ensuring that they are correctly used and stored away at the end of the day. Any damage or missing equipment must be immediately reported to the Equipment Officer or any other committee member
18. Fishing boats are to be treated as an obstruction and given a clearance of 30 metres.
19. Members are prohibited from using cabin cruisers or internal combustion engine power boats on Loch Ard (designated safety and committee boats are exempted).
20. All boats must comply with their class regulations, with particular reference to buoyancy. Members may be asked to demonstrate this compliance.
